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## Sok finds herself, reaches goals

Dedication and persistence define how Hosanna Sok was able to use the Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) program to achieve her goals.

Sok completed the program in December 2020 when she earned her bachelor's degree in nursing. She has worked as a Lincoln Public Schools treatment nurse since last July.

"I love it," she said. "I knew I wanted to work with kids."

Sok hopes to eventually become a school nurse.

"I'm looking at all the schools to see which one might be the right fit for me," she said. "I want to get all my experience first, start from the bottom and work my way up."

Sok appreciates the LHA program and support of FSS Coordinator Amy Wagner for helping her focus on her goals.

"The program helped me see my long-term goals and envision how to get there step by step," she said. "I knew I had to get my degree because I wanted to help my family and myself. I needed to get this degree so I could have a better paying job and find somewhere I love to work — and I found it!"

Now, Sok is better able to provide for herself and her daughters, Lily, 9, and Stella, 9 months.

"I highly recommend LHA tenants to go through the FSS program if they're just stuck in a rut or don't have the finances to go to school," she said.
