RentWise is a tenant education program that helps people know how to find and deep decent rental housing, and how to become more successful renters through education. Renters who complete this program of six modules earn a certificate of completion to show potential landlords and property managers that they want to be good tenants.

RentWise teaches skill to help tenants avoid confrontations.

Why RentWise:

Comparisons between RentWise participants and a control group suggest that participants learn new skills and behaviors.

\$ Participants are more likely to use a spending plan with affordable rent, complete a neat, written rental application, request screening criteria when applying for rental housing, and practice good communication skills with landlords and neighbors.

\$ They are less likely to rely on shelters and have recently changed their children's school.

\$ They are more likely to be in permanent housing, report improvement in their housing, positively evaluate their current neighborhood, and be satisfied with their current housing, as well as the cost of their current housing.

\$ Furthermore they are more likely to feel positive about their life, and to expect their standard of living to improve within the next three years.

RentWise program is intended to help renters to...

- Better understand the benefits of good communication
- Improve ability to resolve problems with neighbors and landlords
- Move less often and increase housing stability
- Know more about searching for safe, affordable housing that meets their needs
- Better manage resources and money

RentWise is for...

- Any individual who needs rental housing
- Young adults moving into independent living
- Individuals and families in emergency shelters or transitional housing
- New immigrants
- Renters who need money management skills to build the credit and rental histories needed to qualify for a mortgage
